




State policy sets the terms and conditions for advancing arts education locally




States have primary responsibility for the education and well-being of their citizens.

But NCLB is **not** the only barrier:




- ✓ Vague or voluntary state laws

How many states collect this information?




Formats Used to Publicly Report State Level Information about Arts Ed




What is the likelihood state policy


