
About This Fact Sheet


Large and small organizations play an important role in serving communities and providing access to arts in diverse ways. This fact sheet focuses on the distribution of GOS grants by budget size. Large organizations are defined as those with revenues of \$1 million or more, and small organizations with revenues less than this threshold. Data excludes records for which total organizational revenue figures are not available (such as project support awards and records without budget data).


Grant Locations FY2023

 states conducted significant assessments of their GOS strategies and formulas while receiving a substantial share
 of COVID-19 pandemic aid funds, which may influence future data trends.
